CONTAINER SELECTION

Rule #1 Drainage

Rule #2 Clean

Rule #3 Pot Material

Rule #4 Pot Size

Rule #5 Pot Style



CONTAINER SELECTION

- Small containers often cannot store enough water for hot days
- Black pots absorb heat, light pots reflect heat and keep roots cool
- Plastic pots retain moisture better than clay or unglazed terra-cotta
- Soak clay pots before planting



Potting Mix Recipe


Ingredients

- •1 part perlite
- •1 part compost
- •1 part garden soil (aka, plain dirt)
- •1 part peat moss or coir

Optional, for extra nutrients

A handful of each:

- •Kelp meal
- Rock phosphate
- Blood meal
- •Garden lime



Troubleshooting Wilting & Browning Leaves

Possible causes

Overheated

Too Much sun

Not enough water or hydration.

• Solutions

Re-locate plant to cover or afternoon shade

You may not be watering deep enough.

Ways to keep Houseplants Happy this Winter

- Sunshine
- Less Water
- Mist
- Humidity
- Tonic
- Dust Them
- Stop Fertilizing
- Get rid of bugs

Troubleshooting Rootbound Plants

Identification

Misshapen or cracked container.

Stunted growth, wilting, and yellowing or brown leaves

Roots visible through soil.

Roots poking through the bottom of container

Possible Causes

Plant is outgrowing container
Plant is receiving less nutrition and hydration.
Roots poking through the bottom of container
Roots may be choking the plant.

• Solutions

Replant in a larger

container for room to grow

Add fresh soil and nutrition

Loosen the root ball before replanting.

Troubleshooting Heat Stress

Identifying

Plant is dropping leaves
Plant has stopped flowering Sunburn

Possible Cause

Very hot outdoor temperature
Too much direct sunlight

• Solutions

Move containers into the shade

Switch container material or color to light-colored planters over dark

Cover plants with shade cloth

Choose containers made from fabric, wood, or resin over metal and ceramic


